Pastoral Notes by Fr. Edmund

Knowing the Shepherd

The image of the Lord as the Shepherd and us as the sheep is a very apt description of our human condition and our need for our Redeemer. Our own human behavior patterns and life habits are so much like that of sheep. We are stubborn, preferring to follow our own fancies and turn to our own ways. "We are all like sheep which have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own ways" (ls.53:6). stubbornness is interlocked with personal pride and self-assertion. We insist that we know what is best for us even though the disastrous results may be self-evident. Just as sheep will blindly, habitually, stupidly follow one another along the same little trails until they become ruts that erode into giant gullies, so we cling to the same habits that we have seen ruin other lives.

Obviously, we human beings need the help and support of the Good Shepherd to redeem us from our hopeless human situation. We need to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd through the Church and its servant leaders to redeem ourselves from our fallen nature. As a community, we seek the will of God in our lives by our personal prayer and discernment and adherence to the Church's teachings. We seek to encounter and experience God in everything we do. Constant connectivity with the Lord is what old theology refers to as "the state of grace", in contrast to "the state of sin".

In the gospels, we hear Jesus telling us: "I have come that they might have life and have it to the full..." Yes, it is only by following our Good Shepherd that we will be safe and find the pasture we need. If we resolutely choose to follow him – both in our private lives and in our public lives – we will be able to sing with the Psalmist: "The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want. In verdant pastures He gives me repose. Beside restful waters, He leads me. He refreshes my soul. He guides me in right paths for His name's sake. Only goodness and kindness follow me all the days of my life. And I shall dwell in the presence of the Lord for years to come." (Ps 23:1-3, 6)

Windows Update. The dedication plaque for the Stained Glass Windows in the Altar area will be: "In Memory of MJ "Sally" Stotts and the Intention of Generous Families... Easter 2018" The St Francis of Assisi stained glass window to be installed this coming May at the back of the church will have the following dedication line: "In loving memory of our dear Father & Nonno Francesco Mele. The Mele & Aucoin Family." A St Kateri stained window is under consideration for the other side of the back of the church. St Kateri is the first indigenous Native American (Algonquin-Mohawk) saint to be canonized in the Roman Catholic Church. The "Lily of the Mohawks" is the patroness for environment and ecology, peoples in exile, Native Americans and World Youth Day. Stained glass for the transom windows of the church is also under consideration. Interested families may contact Fr Edmund for details. We express appreciation to all the families who have supported the initial fundraiser last December 2 for this ongoing project. On another note, the Alberta Urban Municipalities Association will conduct this month an energy audit of our church facility on a grant basis (under \$12,000) after a lengthy application process. The audit will bring about recommendations for a greener and more energy-efficient approach to energy use, possibly including the replacement of our 50+year-old windows.

Mass with Filipino music.. Starting May 6 and on every first Sunday of the month, the El Shaddai Prayer Group will host the 12 noon Mass in English with hymns and songs in Filipino (Tagalog). Commentary, readings, homily and the Mass ritual will be in English. The prayer group with take care of recruiting and assigning lectors, Eucharistic ministers, collectors and ushers. A reception with coffee and goodies is an option. Just like the Sudanese-hosted Masses, this is part of the efforts towards integration of our ethnic groups into our community.
