Pastoral Notes by Fr. Edmund Unity in diversity...

The traditional hymn *Holy God, We Praise Thy Name* has as its closing verse an acknowledgment of the mystery of the Holy Trinity, one God in three persons:

"Holy Father, Holy Son, Holy Spirit, Three we name thee; While in essence only One, Undivided God we claim thee; And adoring, bend the knee, While we own the mystery."

The mystery is reflected in our liturgical prayers. All of the longer endings of the formal prayers as found in the *Sacramentary*, after being addressed to the Father, conclude with the following: "We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever..." We begin the Holy Mass "in the name of the father, Sin and Holy Spirit..." We end the celebration with the blessing over the assembly invoking the Trinitarian formula.

During the celebration of baptism, the candidates are immersed three time in the water of the font or water is poured three time over each of the candidates while the Trinitarian formula is spoken: "I baptize you in the name of the father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is described as the central mystery of our Christian faith, being the mystery of God's very self, from where all of the other divine mysteries proceed.

This mystery of God in the Holy Trinity is reflected in a way in our own human life, having been created in His image and likeness. Our uniqueness of persons is attributed to God's oneness in being. We are all unique in our own way just as God is one in being. The plurality of persons in the Holy Trinity is also reflected in our social nature, in our need for one another and in our sense of community.

"One God, three persons, be near to us who are formed in your image. Dwell in us. We ask this, Father, Son, Holy Spirit, one God, living and true, forever and ever. Amen."
