## The Shepherd Speaks—Fr Eli

**“If any of you lacks wisdom, let him/her ask God, who gives to all men/women generously and without reproaching, and it will be given him/her” (St. James the Greater)**

On July 25, 2021, Sunday, the Catholic Church will be celebrating the feast day of St. James the Greater. St. James was a fisherman and the brother of John. Peter was his partner. When they were called to become Apostles of Jesus, they left everything to do so. St. James is the patron saint of laborers and Spain as well as our parish community.

There were two Apostles named James. James the Greater is the older of the two. He was also called “The Son of Thunder”. James, John, and Peter were honored to be the only Apostles present at the Transfiguration. They were also present in the Garden of Gethsemane while Jesus prayed before His death.

One of the highlights of the celebration of the feast of St. James in our parish is the Volunteer Appreciation Barbeque Evening. This will be on July 24, Saturday 6pm at the parish hall after our weekend Saturday Mass. The said occasion is held to recognize the greatness of the services our volunteers had rendered during this COVID 19 pandemic.

They are our heroes and front liners. They offered their time and talent to serve God and our people. And they continue to make our celebrations safe and sound. Indeed, the hearts of these people radiate and reflect the heart of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd. Let us continue to pray for these parish volunteers and their families.

In today’s Gospel reading, we see Jesus, the Good Shepherd of us all. We can feel the heart of the leader who has care, love, and affection to His people. When the Apostles returned from their mission, tired, and wearied out after their first missionary work, Jesus told them, YOU MUST COME AWAY TO SOME LONELY PLACE, ALL BY YOURSELVES AND REST FOR A WHILE” is how Christ greets them, since with all the crowds thronging round and following him, they would not even have a time to eat in peace.

And yet Jesus refuses to send away these people, rather Jesus welcomes them, listens to them, gives advice to them, provide food they need. If Christ was like this while on earth, will He not be the same towards us now after His resurrection?

The worst sin against others springs not from hatred but from indifference. God is showing us an example of caring and loving others through His Son Jesus Christ. He had compassion with the people because they were like sheep without a shepherd.

Let us continue to encourage others to join our Church’s Masses. Let us support one another in charity and humility. Let us pray for one another for our safety. When that happens and is happening in our faith community, we realize that after all, heaven begins by doing good here on earth.

### Liturgical Guidelines for Stage 3 of Alberta's Open for Summer Plan

- **Masks are no longer mandatory but are encouraged**
- REGISTRATION FOR MASS AND CONTACT TRACING ARE NO LONGER REQUIRED
- There is no capacity limit for in-person attendance
- Entrance and exit doors no longer need to be assigned.
- All pews are available for the use of the congregation
- Pews will continue to be sanitized after Masses—your assistance is greatly appreciated
- The reception of Holy Communion on the tongue is now allowed to resume. Communion will only be given under one species—the consecrated Host
- There is no limit on attendance for Funeral Masses, Weddings and Baptisms

- Practice proper respiratory etiquette (coughing or sneezing into a bent elbow, promptly discarding used tissues in a garbage bin)

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist**

Starting September 2021, the Diocese of Calgary will return to parish-based sacrament preparation for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. These two sacraments will be celebrated during the same school year. Registration for classes is now open through the parish office and will continue through the summer.
