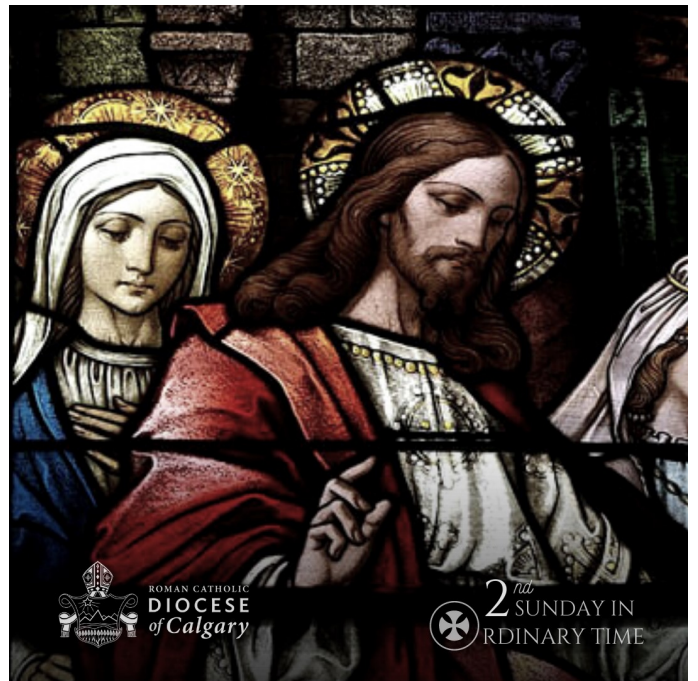

It is with a grateful and hope-filled heart that I would like to express my gratitude and appreciation to the many great individuals, families, lay ministries, organizations, volunteers and our partners in our parish evangelization and mission. In the name of our Pastoral and Finance Council Members, we thank you all for your great services walking together as One People of God.

We also thank our regular and generous donors and givers who financially support the needs of our parish and the maintenance of our Church’s building. May the Lord continue to bless you and your families. We also thank our parish staff for your dedication and hard work especially at these times of pandemic. To you our treasured volunteers, staff, partners, donors, benefactors and parishioners, my fervent prayers for your health, work, and safety. May this New Year 2022 bring us greater hope, deeper trust, and brighter days.

This is now the second year for our preparation for the Synod. Your wonderful testimonies will be published in this column to inspire, encourage, invite our people to share their own encounters with our God too. \*

In our Gospel, Mary says they have no wine. Jesus replies, what is this for me and for you? meaning that while Mary is thinking of ordinary wine, Jesus sees the shortage of wine as the absence of God’s Holy Spirit from the life of the Jewish people ever since the age of the prophets ceased. Mary seems to be suggesting but did not ask for a miracle.

At the beginning of our faith-journey, we are confident, secure, and full of the anticipation of success. But as we go along our journey, we empty ourselves in those worthwhile endeavors of life that call us forth. We are sometimes discouraged, frustrated, and disappointed that we want to give up our relationship with Christ, as husband to his wife, realizing that we have nothing more to give.

It is at this point that we turn once again to Christ, always remembering that without Christ, we can do nothing. We ask the Lord to guide and give us the wine of life, of love and hope to always go back and be reconciled with Him. Amen.
