The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

We have often heard this dictum, "Action speaks louder than words." This seems to be the lesson of our Gospel parable. The first son declared that he would not go to the vineyard as his father had ordered him but realizing that he had to, off he went.

The second son affirmed that he would go and work in the vineyard, but never went. The response of the first son was commendable because, he in fact, followed the will of his father. He was an action person. The first son is the better icon to follow. But there is a third son that hovers in the Gospel which merits reflection.

The third son is no one else but Jesus himself. He said YES to his Father and followed His will. When he agonized at the Mount of Olives, Jesus verbally committed to fulfilling the mission entrusted to Him by His Father. Jesus lived up to his words when He embraced His cross and died on Calvary.

Jesus Christ is a testimony to another dictum: "Actions and words speak the loudest". What does it mean to follow the sonship of Jesus? It means to always say YES to God and to live out our YES by doing the will of God.

At times, this may not be easy because we find the task very difficult. We say Yes at the beginning but eventually change our decision not to do it. There are times we are like the second son. It is sad when we say Yes but never do anything.

At every stage of our lives, deeds not vain hopes or wishes must be our watchword. Neither lip-service of God nor being a Catholic Christian merely in name, will suffice to merit the eternal vision of the glory of God.

What then is vital to our personal relationship to God and to our neighbor? The first thing is honesty. We must be fearlessly honest with God, with others and with ourselves. Without honesty, we are doomed.

Without honesty in our professional and business lives, we will fail. Without honesty, our love relationships will collapse. Without honesty, marriages will fail, and friendships will be lost. We should always remember that Satan is the Father of lies who destroys everything of who we are and what we have.

We should take full responsibility and accountability to God and to others by honestly saying Yes to God and No to evil in our thoughts, words, and actions. If we are honest with others, honest with ourselves and honest with God, then our actions will automatically follow. We will live lives of sincere integrity and act accordingly. In honesty, we will live in peace and happiness.

When we sit in front of God, who are we? Will we say YES to God and not do anything? Will we say NO to God and yet in the end at least try? Let us walk always in the way of the Lord. Always remember that "actions and words speak the loudest".

Safety for Seniors How to Avoid Being Scammed—Don't Take the Bait!

- 1. If you are informed of a problem or crisis via a computer, phone, letter and even in person, you may feel the need to act out of concern, fear or panic. **Stop** and pause before you act.
- 2. E-mail or phone: Do not use the link or any contact information they provide. Move away and think calmly. Do NOT reply to the sender or click links in an email, or call the number they leave. Banks and financial institutions know your information and would not be asking for it. Call the customer service number you usually use for your credit cards, bank cards, or branch to verify the message you've received before acting.
- 3. E-mail: You receive an email from a pastor asking you to get gift cards. **Don't do it!** Instead contact the parish office immediately. These are scams!
- 4. Sometimes people will scam unknowing seniors in person, often developing a friendly rapport with them before anything serious happens. After a time, you may hear varying stories from the person, and eventually, as the relationship develops, begins to ask for money or other favors. **Report any activities to the parish office that make you suspicious or concerned.**
