### The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

How much do we really love God? Jesus was very specific with your whole heart, with your whole soul and with your whole mind. Sometimes, I wonder if this is possible. As I began my ministry shepherding and serving God's people, I had this purity of intention to serve God uncompromisingly.

However, through the years, I found myself making some compromises. When I felt tired and there were still people requesting my service even outside office hours, there were some instances when I would find a way not to heed to their request and just opt to rest.

I must admit I am guilty of failing to reach out sometimes to our parishioners in need of counseling, spiritual direction and even just finding time to talk to a priest. Loving God fully is not easy. When faced with our human nature, we struggle to give ourselves totally to Him.

Yet, God does not merely invite us to love Him but commands us to do so. Thus, we must strive hard to transcend our human nature to love God in the best way we can.

How much can you love our neighbor? Jesus notes that loving your neighbor must always have reference to yourself. This means a solid basis of loving others is authentic self-love. This is very logical. There is a powerful dictum that says, "you cannot give what you do not have."

If you don't love yourself, how can you love others? When I see a person who is so insensitive and indifferent to others, I can usually sense a lack in how this human being values his/her own person. To love oneself is to appreciate the gift of life given to us by God.

Loving God and loving our neighbor always go together. When we show our full love of God, this must eventually flow into loving others. When we love others as ourselves, we manifest that we truly love God with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength.

Pope Benedict XVI said that " love of God and love of neighbor are thus inseparable. They form a single commandment. But both live from the love of God who has loved us first (Deus Caritas #18).

And so, this weekend, I am appealing to every one of you to support our Together In Action (TIA). Your donation and generous financial help are reaching more diocesan ministries and programs in the sixty-eight parishes.

Because of your donations, programs like care for the retired priests and continuing education of seminarians are supported. When you keep on giving and does not give up, it is because your heart full of love gives silently without hope of praise or reward. But know that every charitable act of love is a stepping stone toward heaven, Amen.
