The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

Who is St. John the Baptist? From the day of his birth, people know John is different. What then will this child be? When John grows, he lives in the desert, dresses in skins and eats locusts and honey. In his preaching, he calls people to repent, act justly, and prepare something yet to come-the Kingdom of God.

On August 29 each year, we hear the description of John's death in Mark 6:17-29. John's disciples come to his cell with Christ's answer to the question, are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?

The main focus, however, is on John the Baptist, chained and kneeling in his prison cell. Two soldiers come to him holding a platter, with a sword already pointed toward John who is about to die. John joins his hands in prayer, meeting death with courage, knowing that Christ has come into the world and his own mission is complete.

The message of John calls us to confront and confess our sins, to turn away from them in sincere repentance, to receive God's forgiveness and most importantly, to look to Jesus.

Do we need to receive God's forgiveness? There are basically two reasons why we fail to receive forgiveness. The first is that we fail to repent and the second is that we fail to forgive. Jesus was very explicit about this second failure in Matthew.

Jesus says, for if you forgive men and women their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men and women, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.

Is there someone we need to forgive today? Let us not allow what others to have done to destroy our life. We cannot be forgiven unless we forgive. Let us let go of that bitterness and allow God to work healing in our life.

John's voice was very moving and touching because his life was his message. He lived what he preached. And his humility was great, saying, "the Lord must increase, I must decrease." We are invited by the Church to prepare for Christmas by repenting of our sins and renewing our lives so that Jesus may be reborn in us.

Jesus is inviting us to come home, to stay with Him and rejoice in His mercy and forgiveness. Always remember that every time we go back for confession, it is always a joyful encounter with our God. John the Baptist reminds us too of announcing Christ to others through our lives, at home and in our community.

People around us should recognize Jesus's rebirth in our lives by our sharing of love, unconditional forgiveness, compassionate and merciful heart, and spirit of humble service. Let us accept Jesus as our savior and King. Let us use these days of preparation for Christmas to ready ourselves for Christ's coming remembering that the second coming will happen for each one of us on the day of our death, or on the day of the Lord, whichever comes first.

What do I profit if Jesus is born in the thousands of cribs all over the world unless He is born in my heart and soul?
