

# The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near! The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice. This is the message expressed by St. Paul when he wrote this letter to the Philippians while he was in a dark Roman prison and without any certainty that he can still come out alive.

There was nothing to rejoice about in that situation. But joy is a virtue and a gift of the Holy Spirit. It is not dependent on any external condition. Rather, it all depends on one's intimate relationship with God. Rightly then that St. Paul said, "rejoice in the Lord always." Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near!

So, to express our joy in the coming of Jesus as our Savior into our hearts, we lit the rose/pink candle in the Advent wreath. Indeed, there are several reasons why we rejoice. We rejoice at the thought that Jesus is going to be reborn in our lives, deepening in us His gifts of love and mercy and touching our hearts to see the good in every situation.

Last second Sunday of Advent in the 10 am Mass celebrating the children's liturgy, I am just amazed by the children in our Church smiling, brimming with joy and sometimes taking my attention of their noise. However, in the positive side of life, there is so much hope and joy in our community.

The voices of our children simply remind us of God's faithfulness to us in times that life is tough. While we see and hear members of our communities passed away and gone, there are also new babies consecrated to our Church for Baptism.

With God who lives with us and with God wanting to bless us ever more fully, we will be graced, and we are graced, and the Lord will continue to help us. And do not be ashamed that we are terrified, and we tremble at times. We have limits. We have weaknesses. We have strengths. God will assure us that if we trust in His power, nothing will be impossible.

With us walking with Him together as one family, we believe that God will continue to bless us with His grace. We are blessed. And we will continue to be blessed by the light of Christ's love and mercy. We need to trust and learn how to survive a faith-crisis.

On such occasions, Robert Cardinal Sarah has something to tell us. He said, "our life of faith most often walks in the night. The more faith has to confront trials, the stronger it becomes. Nights of faith always end with finding the little light of God.

As we pray today, we also rejoice that the Lord does not fail to show His power and might when we are down and in despair. As we pray today, we also rejoice because the Lord continues to strengthen us in our troubles and anxieties.

John is giving us a wonderful example. John lives totally for Jesus. His very being, his identity as a person is found in Jesus. As the example of John is telling us so clearly, the truth of the matter is, we find our identity when we live for others.

The key is love. When we love and care for others, as John did, we find ourselves. When we live for others, our whole becomes filled with meaning and happiness. May God bless us and help us to live for one another. In this way, we find ourselves and discover who we truly are.
