The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." (John 1:36)

It can be easy to miss Jesus. Just ask John the Baptist. John knew he had been called to prepare the way for the Messiah. He was even the kinsman of Jesus. But still, by his own admission, John did not know him. He did not fully understand the mission of Jesus.

But with time and insight from God, John did come to recognize Jesus as the Messiah and was able to proclaim, "look, here is the Lamb of God." We may not always recognize Jesus as clearly as John did. Yet, just like John, we too can grow in our awareness little by little.

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." Make it a goal to greet Jesus the moment you first wake up. This week, make it a personal resolution to say, "good morning, Lord" and thank Him for the blessing that a new day brings. The Lord takes delight to see you and your family starting your day with even the briefest of prayers and conversation with Him.

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." This morning greeting can be a great occasion for you to spend a quiet time of meditation. Even if it is only 5 minutes, a regular time of prayer will help you grow more familiar with Jesus.

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." Once the onslaught of the day begins, you might struggle with a busy schedule. Know that Jesus does not want you to forget that He is with you.

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." In the evening, you might hit a point when you are ready to unwind. You made it through the day, and you did it with God's help. Before going to sleep, you can pause to thank Jesus for how He was with you today.

You can look back and try to recall one or two ways that the Lord blessed you with peace, guidance, and safety. Jesus, the Lamb of God is with you. The Lord loves it when you notice him, just a little more each day.

"Look, here is the Lamb of God." Every time we gather in faith to celebrate the Holy Mass, the priest humbly remembers and makes present these words of John pointing to Jesus, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, blessed are those called to partake in the supper of the Lamb".

The Lamb. That's what Jesus is called in today's Gospel. This gentle symbol would never be considered as a fitting logo for the mighty people of today. Imagine a hockey team being called "The Lambs" or a football team being called "The Lambs".

The Lamb symbol has a rich history and is intimately associated with some tremendous salvific events. The lamb was ceremoniously eaten in Egypt on the eve of Exodus. The Lamb again was present on the Last Supper table, the night before Jesus died.

At each Mass, we cry out the triumphant chant, not once but three times. "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. By this, we profess that humanity's admirable Servant walked through this world, showing us that gentleness is toughness. The Lamb theology is teaching us as Jesus says, anyone among you who aspires greatness must serve the rest. (Mt. 20: 25). Amen.
