The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

I had this graced opportunity to join a pilgrimage in Holy Land in 2019. This was before covid set in. One of the holy places we visited is Mount Tabor where Jesus had his transfiguration. I was totally amazed by the heavenly bliss of serenity, calmness, quietness, and the sacredness of the surroundings.

If only I could stay longer and pray to give thanks to the Lord for the amazing wonders of His creation. Mount Tabor is a 360-degree view of the Jezreel Valley, Mount Gilboa, the Samarian mountains, Mount Carmel, the Golan Heights, Gilead Afula, the Lower and Upper Galilee and even Mount Hermon at the Lebanese border to the north. It was an experience of great spiritual beauty and grace to be there in the very site where Jesus transfigured Himself before Peter, James, and John.

What is the meaning of the Tabor experience? At Mount Tabor, Jesus felt himself comforted and affirmed by His heavenly Father's presence and support. By this, Jesus knew that the Father was pleased with him and would give him strength to face the challenges ahead. He knew that with God on His side, Jesus could face anything.

The transfiguration event of Jesus is a glimpse of his divinity and glory. The Transfiguration event reveals to Peter, James, and John the true and identity of Jesus. They saw his divine splendor. Then, the Father made his filial affirmation of Jesus.

The Father said, "this is my chosen Son, listen to Him." Witnessing Moses and Elijah confirmed that Jesus is the culmination of the Law and the Prophet whom they stand for, respectively.

Do you remember the event in the garden of Gethsemane? Jesus was praying to His Father with the same disciples, Peter, James, and John. Jesus prayed, "Father, if possible, let this cup of suffering pass away, not my will but your will be done." It is in this agony in the garden that the disciples of Jesus saw and witnessed the great suffering that Jesus will encounter.

Hence, if they are to follow Jesus, they too, will share in his suffering. They will also encounter persecution, humiliation, and rejection. They will also die. With these trials and forthcoming sufferings, fears, doubts, and anxieties slowly discouraged them to follow Jesus. But Jesus did not allow these things to happen. Jesus brought them again in Mt. Tabor to witness His divine glory and majesty.

The transfiguration event is an encouragement for the disciples to go on as they follow Jesus. It is an inspiration for them to hold on, to stay and listen to Jesus. It is a motivation for them to face bitter realities and sufferings.

And the things that they saw fires them up. But it is not yet the time. They must go down. They must return to their jobs. They must face the daily realities of the Cross and the Calvary. The transfiguration of Jesus is a call and an invitation for Peter, James, and John to a life of transformation and conversion.

Let us not be discouraged by the trials, sufferings, and crosses that we have in life but to be steadfast in the promise of the Lord. Let us always remember that the sufferings that we are experiencing now are nothing to be compared to the glory that will be revealed to us. The good news that the Lord proclaims to us is that we are made for heaven.

Communion Under Both Kinds

As per the Roman Catholic Diocese of Calgary, and at the discretion of the Pastor, the distribution of the Precious Blood *may* resume beginning the First Sunday of Lent (Feb 17 & 18) but this is not a requirement. Parishes will need to prepare and inform parishioners of the principles that need to be observed.

Our Extraordinary Ministers of Communion have met and they have all agreed that **three critical elements are needed** before we resume the distribution of the Precious Blood at St. James Church:

1. a program of information regarding all aspects of concern and education be

conducted through the bulletin and Mass announcements

2. the parishioners have time to absorb and comment on this direction and express their feelings toward it

3. the ministry of Communion leaders have time to work with current members about this direction and have time to find additional ministers required for each Mass

When we receive Christ from either the host or the chalice, we are receiving the fullness of Jesus' body, blood, soul, and divinity. Receiving both species is not required to receive the fullness of the sacrament. Once the Precious Blood is available, parishioners who prefer to receive the Precious Body only can continue to do so.
