

## The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli

" May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit, you may abound in hope. " Romans 15:13

Yes, our souls find rest in God. Our hope comes from Him. For truly God is our rock and our salvation. He is our fortress, and we will not be shaken. As we begin February 2024, I invite you my dear people of God to rejoice, remember and reflect the power of hope that comes from our God.

Hope. This week, let us keep in our hearts the virtue of hope. And we have in our readings today about Job who went through hard times in life yet with confidence in the promises of God, he never gave up.

Job prayed and desired something good for the future. Job expected it to happen. And not expected it to happen, Job was confident that it would happen. And the best things in his life came.

Who is Job? Job is described as a good person, who respected God and refused to do evil. A hardworking man, he provided a decent and good life for his family. But eventually, little by little all his riches lost, his children had severe sickness and his wife started to discourage him to trust God.

His wife told him, Job, are you out of your mind? Why do you continue to believe in your God when everything that matters to us is lost? Job told his wife, "Let us never give up on our God. God has given, God has taken away, blessed be the name of the Lord."

Job continued to bare his heart to the Lord. It is easy to offer God our praises and thanks. But Job challenges us to offer to God even the many questions and the deepest emotions in our hearts. For God alone can satisfy our cries and give us comfort and rest.

Do you know what happened towards the end of the life story of Job? The Lord restored the fortunes of Job, and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning and he had 14,000 thousand sheep, 6,000 camels, a thousand yoke of oxen and a thousand donkeys.

Job also had seven sons and three daughters. In all the land, there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters and Job gave them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this, Job lived for 140 years and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations and died, old and full of days.

"Everyone is searching for you" the disciples say to Jesus in the Gospel. People must have found strong reasons why they searched for Jesus just as we also have in our hearts reasons why we seek out Jesus and constantly long and yearn to remain and stay with Him.

Jesus wants to fill us with hope, so we can see the possibilities. The Lord is inviting us to open our hearts, minds, and souls to the possibilities. For God, all things are possible. May our prayer be "Lord, increase our faith and help us to see the possibilities," Amen.

## WHY SHOULD WE NOT GIVE TO PANHANDLERS OUTSIDE OUR CHURCH DOORS?

Recently, we've had a group of people asking for money outside our church doors as parishioners exit after Masses on Sunday. These individuals have been asked to leave multiple times as they are trespassing. But as long as well-meaning parishioners give, they continue to come back. There is a group known by other parishes that make their rounds to the parishes every year. The more people give, the more they come back. Please **DO NOT** give to these individuals. If giving stops, they move on. Sadly, the majority of these individuals—even those with children—are involved in illegal activities targeting the generous nature of churchgoers. As the police service will only come if trespassing is occurring, please call the police to report them and have them removed. **We need your help to stop this activity.** We've had an increase of people loitering around the church at all hours of the day and night so anything we can do to help keep our building and parishioners safe is important. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
