RDINARY TIME

February 11, 2024

The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli "If you choose, you can make me clean"

These words came out from the man with leprosy begging Jesus and kneeling before the Lord. Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out His hand and touch the person with leprosy and said to him, "I do choose. Be made clean." Immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean.

We need to trust in the mercy of a forgiving God who assures us that our sins are forgiven and that we are clean. We are forgiven and made spiritually clean from the spiritual leprosy of sins because God is a God of love who waits patiently for us. The only condition required of us is that we ask for forgiveness with a repentant heart.

People with leprosy were not only considered physically loathsome but were looked upon as persistent sinners. Even if the people with leprosy were cured, they had to submit to a ritual cleansing and purging of sin before they would be re-admitted to society.

By instructing the healed person with leprosy to go and show himself to the priest, Jesus may have been challenging the religious authorities to see that God's healing grace is available to anyone who asks and needs His help.

What are you asking for to Jesus? What are you looking for? What are we needing as we come to Jesus? The hungry are asking for food. The homeless are asking for shelter. The unemployed are looking for jobs. Immigrants are asking for compassions. War-torn countries are looking for the end of conflicts and violence and yearning to have peace.

What are we personally asking for? Jesus meant for the question to go deeper than just economic, financial or health issues. Jesus is really asking, what is your heart asking and longing for? Appreciation, forgiveness, freedom from stress and worry? Are you asking for inner peace and healing?

This year 2024, Pope Francis chooses the theme " it is not good that man should be alone" as we celebrate the 32nd World Day of the Sick. Caring for the sick is caring for our relationships. The World Day of the Sick is offering us another opportunity to pray for all those who suffer and to reflect on our commitment beginning in our families and communities.

We are all invited to have the compassionate gaze of Jesus towards those who suffer, are alone, marginalized and rejected. By working together to counter the culture of individualism and indifference, we can grow the culture of tenderness and compassion in our family and community.

In our parish this February 2024, we offer the anointing of the sick and the prayer of blessing for all residents of our Senior Homes namely the Garrison Green, Stay Well Manor and Royal Park. We also celebrate in our Church a Healing Mass that is open to everyone.

As we celebrate the World Day of the Sick, I invite you to honor and recognize the noble contributions of our Pastoral Care Volunteers and Ministers. These amazing people continue to take concrete steps to accompany those who are ill and isolated. Gratitude also goes to all healthcare professionals and other volunteers.

As we renew our commitment to pray for healing and care of the sick, let us learn from the faith of the person with leprosy who said to Jesus," If you choose, you can make me clean." Believe that Jesus is trustworthy, and He will heal and listen to you, Amen.

WHY SHOULD WE NOT GIVE TO PANHANDLERS OUTSIDE OUR CHURCH DOORS?

Recently, we've had a group of people asking for money outside our church doors as parishioners exit after weekend Masses. These individuals have been asked to leave multiple times as they are trespassing. But as long as well-meaning parishioners give, they continue to come back. There is a group known by other parishes that make their rounds to the parishes every year. Please **DO NOT** give to these individuals. If giving stops, they move on. Sadly, the majority of these individuals—even those with children—are involved in illegal activities targeting the generous nature of churchgoers. As the police service will only come if trespassing is occurring, ask them to leave, and please call the police to report them and have them removed. **We need your help to stop this activity.** We've had an increase of people loitering around the church at all hours of the day and night so anything we can do to help keep our building and parishioners safe is important. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.
