

The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

"Jesus said to his disciples, "I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit."

How beautiful it is to watch shoots of young wheat swaying in the wind and dancing in the sun. I still remember the times I would drive around the places in Vauxhall and Taber (my first parish assignments) and in the neighbouring communities. This is truly the wonders of God's creation. But how strange is the process by which these shoots come into being.

First, the grains of wheat have to be buried in the cold earth as in a tomb. Then, they must die. If they did not die, no new life would come forth. But, when they die, from the grave of the old grains, shoots of new wheat miraculously spring forth. In time, each of these shoots will produce a whole earful of new grains. It is indeed an amazing paradox-life coming through death.

The way of salvation is similar. It is Christ who is telling us this. Just as the grain of wheat has to die if it is to bear fruit, so there is a sense in which we must die if we are to live fully and fruitfully. We are like seeds dropped by the hands of God into the field of life. Under his watchful care, we break through the surface and open ourselves to the sun and the rain. But having opened us to receive, we must also open ourselves to give. For to give is to live.

Today's Gospel speaks of the grain of wheat dying in the ground-a reference to the shedding of the blood of the Lord Jesus in order to bring forth a rich harvest recalled those words of Jeremiah at the Last Supper as we do at every Mass.

Jesus endured the cross because He knew that his death would reveal the depths of God's love for you and me.

Christ is inviting us to let that love surround and sustain us in building up one another. We are called in our family and parish community to imitate the love of our God, the courage to stand up for that love, the willingness to serve and to work for unity.

In the offertory part of the Mass, we notice the wine poured into the chalice and then a little water is added. The wine is strong and powerful. It represents the love of Christ. The water is weak and powerless. This represents our love.

However, when the water is mixed with the wine, it becomes one with the water and is invigorated and strengthened. It is consecrated and raised up as a chalice of salvation.

Let our love be mingled with the love of Christ. May it be a chalice of renewal, a spirit of healing and forgiveness, a sign of hope and new life. May God inspire us to pour it out until the end, Amen.

Our diocesan goal is the same as last year: \$2 million. Nearly 50% of the proceeds will go to caring for our retired priests. hospital chaplaincy, and pastoral care. Approximately 10% will support diocesan missions, Mission Council and Elizabeth House. Another 15% will help organizations, such as CCCB (Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops), Calgary Catholic Immigration Society, and the Canadian Catholic Bioethics Institute.
