

The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

"God did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all. "(Romans 8:32)

Today, we begin the Holy week with the Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. Our attention is focus on the sacrificial death of Jesus. The Gospel narrates the humiliation, passion, and crucifixion of Jesus. Jesus fulfills the will of the Father. Jesus translates into reality his preaching. Jesus shows in his passion what true love is.

Jesus reveals what real forgiveness is. There is no bitterness in his words. There is no hatred or anger in his heart. There is no frustration or resentment in his feelings. Jesus willingly and openly embraces and accepts the Cross and the Crucifixion.

This Palm Sunday, we commemorate the hour when Jesus entered the holy city of Jerusalem for the last time. It was a triumphal entry of Jesus as King, reminding us of King David when he entered and took possession of Jerusalem.

The whole multitude of his disciples proclaimed, blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord. He entered Jerusalem but that is just the beginning. We must follow Jesus, from the gates of Jerusalem to the upper room, to the garden of Gethsemane, to the Praetorium, to Calvary and then to the tomb where Jesus gloriously rose from the dead.

We are all invited to accompany Jesus in His sufferings and death, to follow Him. We lift and wave our palm branches, aware that these are not only symbols of victory but also martyrdom. We shout Hosanna!

But when our faith is tested and when we are asked to carry our own Crosses in life, we stop following. We flee from our crosses. We complain. And we start to doubt the power of God as our Savior and King.

One of the most striking aspects of the Gospel Passion accounts is how largely alone Our Lord Jesus in his final hours. Most of His beloved disciples, followers and friends flee from Him and abandon Him in His hour of need. We are challenged to examine our own lives in the light of some of the characters in the Passion story.

Peter denied Jesus three times, Judas who betrayed Jesus, Herod who ridiculed Jesus, Pilate who acted against his conscience as he condemned Jesus to death on the Cross and the leaders of the people who preserved their position by getting rid of Jesus.

As we enter the Holy Week, it is good to reflect and remember the times when we flee from the Cross and from our Savior. We all do it at one point or another. A period of suffering for ourselves, a loved one, our neighbor, or even the people we encounter in our daily lives.

Jesus is now inviting us to follow Him. Are we willing to follow Jesus not just to Church but in our daily life? Are we willing to entrust ourselves to Him even when the future is not certain and confusing, believing that God has a great plan for us?

Let us be moved and encouraged by the few people who stayed with Jesus. Our heavenly Mother Mary and St. John and other faithful women stayed with Jesus at the foot of the Cross until the death of Jesus. They became the witnesses of Jesus. They were touched. They accepted Jesus and confessed, truly, "this man is the Son of God," Amen.
