

The Shepherd Speaks—Fr. Eli Canete

Today, in the Diocese of Calgary, there is an urgency and a need to encourage and pray for our young men and women to respond to God's call to serve His Church and His people.

Currently in this year 2024, the Diocese of Calgary alone has only 13 seminarians who are preparing for priesthood. And we have 68 parishes and 11 missions waiting for them. Vocations begin in the family. Let us open the doors for our children the path to enter seminaries and consider priesthood and religious and consecrated life as one of the options in choosing a career.

In John 15:16, Jesus is calling young men and women to serve His flock. Jesus said, "it was not you who chose me, but I who chose you."

In the Gospel Jesus said: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He knows his sheep and loves them so much that he is ready to die for them."

The Gospel offers us both comfort and challenge. The comforting good news is that Jesus, the Good Shepherd knows us, provides for us, and loves us. The challenge is for each of us to become good shepherds to those entrusted to our care and become also good sheep.

Jesus knows His sheep and His sheep hear His voice. Jesus knows each one of us, our needs, our dreams, our prayers, our merits, and faults. Jesus loves us as we are, with all our limitations and he expects us to receive and return His love by keeping His word.

Jesus speaks to us at every Mass, through the Scripture, through our parents and through the events of our lives. God whispers to us in our pleasures, God speaks to us in our consciences, and He shouts to us in our pain.

Jesus gives eternal life to His sheep by receiving us into his sheepfold through Baptism. Jesus strengthens our Faith by giving us the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. Jesus supplies food for our souls by the Holy Eucharist and by the Divine Words of the Scripture. Jesus makes our community holy by the sacraments of Matrimony and the Priesthood.

Peter asserts before the Jewish assembly that there is no salvation except through Christ the Good Shepherd. Moreover, John tells us how Yahweh the Good Shepherd of the Old Testament expressed His love for us through His Son Jesus Christ by making us His children.

Jesus is inviting us who are touched and healed by His love to shepherd and care for others. There are other sheep that are not of this fold and these Jesus must lead as well. Pope Francis said, "it is so important to pursue and help everyone-not just those who have lived under strict Church doctrine."

Instead of being just a Church that welcomes and receives by keeping the doors open, let us try also to be a Church that finds new roads, that can step outside itself and go to those who do not attend Mass, to those who have quit or are different. The ones who quit sometimes do it for reasons that, if properly understood and assessed, can lead to a return.

"The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia." (Communion Antiphon)
